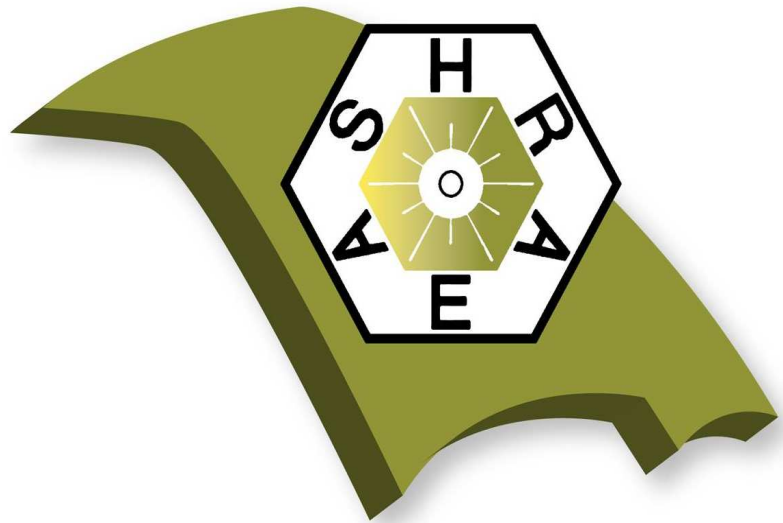

OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES

The Ozarks region is abundant in opportunities to explore the great outdoors. Whether your interests lie in hiking through lush forests, spending the day swimming at the lake or fishing for “the big one”, there are many choices available:

- **Busiek State Forest.**

Busiek State Forest consists of 2,505 acres of forest and includes camping sites and hiking trails. The park is open all year and is accessible by following signs from Highway 65, between Springfield and Branson.

- **Table Rock Lake.**

Created from the White River, Table Rock Lake is a man-made lake that stretches through parts of southwest Missouri and Northwest Arkansas. The lake is maintained by the Army Corps of Engineers and is popular for camping, boating and fishing for largemouth bass, catfish, crappie and bluegill.

- **Lake Taneycomo.**

Cold water from the bottom of Table Rock Lake pours from the Table Rock Dam spillways into a second reservoir, known as Lake Taneycomo. The lake is well-known for trout fishing and tours are available at the Shepherd of the Hills Trout Hatchery at the foot of the dam.
